Internship Description:

VNEC is looking for candidates interested in communications, education, advocacy, and government relations for part-time internships helping to advance the nuclear industry in Virginia.

Internships will be for 6 months, and interns will spend up to 8 hours a week supporting the VNEC Executive Director. This is not a paid internship.

- Will gain experience on the communication, advocacy, business development, government relations and community outreach.
- Will have the opportunity to observe, interact, and network with an array of industry leaders in the Commonwealth.
- Interns will have the opportunity to learn about strategic communications and public affairs

Requirements:

- Must be a student at a Virginia University
- Student must be interested in the nuclear industry
- Student must have attended four semesters as a full-time student
- Ability to work remotely
- Meet deadlines

- Strong research and writing ability
- High level of comfort with social media and other online platforms
- Strong research, analytic and writing skills
- Ability to write, think, and operate both independently and on a team
- Strong organizational skills and attention to detail
- Demonstrated ability to communicate effectively and work collaboratively
- Attention to detail and willingness to take initiative.
